Page 3	Ask two (2) MTWAC members who know you and your family line to complete the NOMINATION FORM . We understand that not all descendants are connected to mob or known by MTWAC members. In this instance, it is important to provide clear family tree lines. The Elders will review the family tree and may recommend nomination by Membership Committee members.
Page 4	Complete the STAT DECLARATION and have it signed by a Notary, there is a list of occupations who can sign the declaration on page 5. Or you can access a digital declaration through MyGov
